*WHEREAS*, on July 28, 2021, I issued Executive Order 2021-24 ordering a State of Local Emergency due to increased infections and hospitalizations caused by COVID-19; and

*WHEREAS*, no State of Local Emergency declared pursuant to the Florida Emergency Management Act may continue for more than seven (7) days unless renewed; and


*WHEREAS*, COVID-19 continues to pose a public health threat to the people of Orange County.

***NOW, THEREFORE,***

I, Jerry L. Demings, County Mayor of Orange County, Florida, acting as the Director of Emergency Management, promulgate the following Executive Order, to take immediate effect:

1. The State of Local Emergency declared in Executive Order 2021-24 is continued for seven (7) days from the date and time hereof, and may be extended in seven (7) day increments or less, as necessary, pursuant to Section 252.38(3)(a)5, Florida Statutes.
2. Except as amended herein, Executive Order 2021-24 is ratified and reaffirmed.
