

Neighborhoods Matter

- Primacy of neighborhoods is important because neighborhoods are where most people live and raise their families, invest their savings and spend their time. A basic function of a municipality is to protect the homes and neighborhoods of its citizens from:
 - Crime and personal injury,
 - Declining property values,
 - Aggressive driving on neighborhood streets,
 - Structural deterioration through lax code enforcement in the neighborhood, and
 - Other obnoxious and threatening intrusions



Neighborhoods Matter

- The second reason is personal economics. Homes should be appreciating assets. Historically, home investment has been the primary means for creating family wealth.
- The third reason is economics. Neighborhoods are an important part of the county's tax base.



Neighborhoods Matter

- Finally, neighborhoods matter to business. Strong neighborhoods matter from the perspective of community economic development.
- Businesses decide, in part, where to locate based on the places where they and their employees will live.
 - Restaurants and retail businesses make decisions based upon census data and aesthetics.
 - How does the area look?

- Use a "project" or "activity" approach
 - New pocket park
 - Septic to sewer conversions
 - 5k road race
 - Walking clubs
 - Front entrance work day
 - Parades/picnics etc.
- All work should be about things people CAN SEE





Complete Neighborhoods

- Areas should have the following amenities:
 - Neighborhood structure
 - Variety of housing types
 - Parks & open spaces
 - Schools
 - Pedestrian-friendly streets
 - Shopping and nearby services





Neighborhood Safety

- Low crime statistics
- Existing neighborhood watch groups
- Adequate speed control
- LED street lighting
- Reminder: This is a shared responsibility between the Sheriff, County, and neighborhood









Neighborhood Economic

- Increasing property values
- % of rentals- keep under 30%
- Entranceways- clean & mold-free
- Right-of-ways- free of trash and snipe signs
- Tree canopies- existence of & well maintained





Neighborhood Infrastructure

- Potable water and sewer
- Flooding concerns
- LED street lighting
- Condition of sidewalks
- Roads resurfaced
- Trails/parks/open spaces





- Neighborhood Social
 - Better advocacy at city hall
 - More social opportunities
 - Parades
 - Road races (5k)
 - Walking Groups
 - Building social infrastructure
 - Newsletters
 - Social Media Presence





- Neighborhood Sustainability
 - Sustainable social structure
 - Regular social engagement
 - Maintaining water resources
 - Bear management practices
 - Proper recycling habits
