Youth Services

The following programs are jointly funded by Orange County Government and/or the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice and/or Department of Children and Families (DCF). Most programs are open to all Orange County residents.

Family Counseling provides counseling services for families struggling with adolescent children and teenagers, especially those who are truant, runaway or ungovernable. **407-254-9370**

Oaks Community Intervention Program provides intensive community-based supervision, counseling, and support for youth recently placed on probation. **407-836-8761**

Youth Shelter provides temporary housing for youth experiencing a variety of problems. Open 24 hours, seven days per week, youth at the shelter may be homeless, runaways, lockouts or may be seeking a cooling off period during a family crisis. **407-836-7626**

Family Preservation & Stabilization is a voluntary, in-home family intervention service for families whose children are at risk of removal due to abuse or neglect. FPS only accepts referrals from DCF. **407-836-9529**

Volunteer and Mentoring

Volunteer opportunities are available in the Youth & Family Services Division. Become a mentor to children living in a foster group home. Juvenile Assessment Center

Juvenile Assessment Center Program is a centralized processing center for youth taken into custody by law enforcement for an alleged delinquent act. The Assessment Center functions include detainable and non-detainable screening: health, mental health, substance abuse, physical health and suicide screening. **407-836-8824**

Changing Adolescents' Perspectives (C.A.P.)

Changing Adolescents' Perspectives (C.A.P.) provides services to Orange County youth that are first-time offenders or on probation for the first time. It is our goal to deter and eliminate delinquent behavior, as well as educate and empower our youth so that they flourish into productive citizens. Our core program areas are Anger Management, Impulse Control, Life Skills, Understanding the Judicial System, Social Media Awareness, and Peer Pressure. **407-836-8778**

Great Oaks Village

Jointly funded by Orange County Government and the Florida Department of Children & Families. Community Based Care of Central Florida provides all program participants.

Great Oaks Village is a residential foster care group home for children 6-18+ who have been removed from their homes by the State of Florida due to abuse, neglect or abandonment. The facility is comprised of five cottages. Children receive educational, recreational, medical and counseling services. One of our cottages is a Welcome Center for children 0-17 years of age who will reside with us up to 23 hours until a more permanent placement can be made. **407-836-7665**
