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- The Wekiva River and Rock Springs Run are impaired for nutrients:
 - phosphorus and
 - the nitrate form of nitrogen
- Excess nutrients cause overabundance of algae
- Algae can cause
 - fish kills
 - smother river bottom
 - reduce the diversity of plants and animals





- 2016 Florida Springs and Aquifer Protection Act requires update to BMAP
 - Creates Priority Focus Area (PFA) Boundary
 - 5, 10, 15 year milestones
 - 100% reduction plan by year 15
 - Requires treatment of septic loads
 - Requires education plan
 - Orange County is the largest stakeholder
 - Significant financial investment is required to meet State standards





Priority Focus Area Requirements

- Remediation plan for any BMAP where septic tanks contribute to more than 20% of load to an Outstanding Florida Spring
 - Target lots on less than 1 acre
 - Target lots where groundwater is most vulnerable
- FDOH permitting authority
 - Failure of existing system upgrade drainfield or connect to sanitary system if available
 - New subdivisions install enhanced drainfield or be subject to future conversions




- 1,427 subdivisions with septic tanks subdivisions in the Wekiwa BMAP PFA
- 769 subdivisions

- Existing septic tank to be abandoned, drain field abandoned in place
- New sewer service lateral will be installed from home main line to connection point at property line near right of way cleanouts
- Installed in accordance with plumbing codes

Pressure System	\$30,000
Advanced Treatment Unit (ATU)	\$15,000 to \$20,000
Drainfield Replacement	\$5,000 to \$10,000

Orange County is constructing a wastewater collection system in the Sweetwater West, Palms 1 and Palms 2 areas as part of the County-wide Septic Tank Retrofit Program. A series of community-wide meetings were held where the attendees expressed the desire for the Septic Tank Retrofit Program in these areas and to have the area designated as a Municipal Service Benefit Unit (MSBU).

An MSBU designation provides property owners the one-time opportunity to pay for their share of the cost of the wastewater collection system over a 10-year period. A fixed amount assessment would be included on the annual property tax bill of all benefiting properties. County policy requires that input from affected property owners be obtained to determine if a significant interest exists for the establishment of the MSBU before scheduling a public hearing with the Orange County Board of County Commissioners (Board). The enclosed ballot is the means to make this determination.

Your property has been identified as one that would be included in the project and you would be responsible for the costs indicated below.

The estimated MSBU special assessment would be \$x,xxx per lot which includes the benefited property's share of the cost of construction work within the property's boundaries and the private property cost components and fees (i.e. connection of the dwelling's plumbing to the sewer main, abandonment of septic tank, etc.), and the Orange County Utilities Capital Fee. The designation of the project area as an MSBU allows property owner costs to be financed over a 10-year period. The cost would be added to your real estate tax bill as an annual non-ad valorem assessment and includes interest at the rate of x.x% and a \$2.50 administration fee. Utilizing the 10-year MSBU financing, the annual assessment for the wastewater collection system and private property cost components and fees would be \$xxx per year beginning on your November 2021 real estate tax bill and for nine years thereafter, unless paid in full at an earlier date

Please read the enclosed ballot carefully and indicate on the ballot whether you are *in favor of* or *not in favor of* the establishment of the Wekiwa Springs Area Septic Tank Retrofit MSBU in your area. This ballot must be returned in a postmarked envelope by DAY, DATE to be counted in the tabulation of ballots.



Your response to this ballot is essential in determining the preference of the property owners. If, within 30 days of the above date, two-thirds of the returned ballots are cast in favor of the establishment of the proposed MSBU, a public hearing before the Board will be scheduled. If a public hearing is scheduled, all affected property owners will be notified of the date and time of such public hearing by mail. The purpose of the public hearing is to give the property owners the opportunity to voice their support for, or opposition to, the MSBU to the Board. Please understand that if a public hearing is scheduled, the <u>final</u> decision concerning the establishment of the Wekiwa Springs Area Septic Tank Retrofit MSBU Resolution rests with the Board.
