WHEREAS, on September 26, 2022, I issued Emergency Executive Order 2022-01 ordering a State of Local Emergency due to the threat posed by Hurricane Ian; and

WHEREAS, no State of Local Emergency declared pursuant to the Florida Emergency Management Act may continue for more than seven (7) days, unless renewed; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2022, Emergency Executive Order No. 2022-01 was extended seven (7) days to October 10, 2022 by Emergency Executive Order No. 2022-02; and

WHEREAS, on October 10, 2022, Emergency Executive Order No. 2022-01 was extended an additional seven (7) days to October 17, 2022 by Emergency Executive Order No. 2022-03, and it may be extended for additional periods of time; and

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian, there continues to be a threat to the health, safety, welfare and property of the people of Orange County.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jerry L. Demings, County Mayor of Orange County, Florida, acting as the Director of Emergency Management, promulgate the following Emergency Executive Order, to take immediate effect:

- 1. The State of Local Emergency declared in Emergency Executive Order 2022-01, as extended for additional seven (7) day periods by Emergency Executive Order 2022-02 and Emergency Executive Order 2022-03, respectively, is hereby extended for an additional seven (7) from the date and time hereof, and may be further extended in seven (7) day increments or less, as necessary, pursuant to Section 252.38(3)(a)5, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Except as amended herein, Emergency Executive Order 2022-01 is ratified and reaffirmed.
