Prescription Drug Abuse, Misuse and Disposal of Unused or Unwanted Prescription Drugs



Prescription Drugs (after marijuana and alcohol) is the most commonly abused substance by Americans 14 and older. (NIDA)



70% of children who abuse prescription drugs admit to getting them from family or friends. (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration)



Protect your kids and keep your families safe by storing medications securely at home.



Talk to your children about the dangers of taking medications without a prescription.



Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold. (DEA)



Flushing your medications - wastewater treatment processes cannot remove all the chemicals that are found in some pharmaceuticals which can cause harmful effects on the environment.
