Purpose

- Ordinance Overview
 - Chapter 15, Article V (Noise Pollution Control Ordinance), originally adopted in 1986 and updated in 1995, 2008, and 2014
- Current Enforcement & Reporting
 - EPD: commercial/industrial noise
 - OCSO: residential/commercial noise
 - Complaints via 311, OCSO non-emergency, and commissioner offices



- Resident & Commissioner Concerns
 - Growing volume of unresolved noise complaints
- Board Direction to Proceed
 - On Sept. 9, 2024, BCC directed EPD to develop updated ordinance language
- Comprehensive Review Conducted
 - Noise Ordinance evaluated to address public input and clarify outdated provisions

Background

Noise Pollution Impacts on Public Health

Physical

- Hearing loss
- Cardiovascular problems
- Sleep disturbance

Mental

- Increased stress and anxiety
- Cognitive impairment
- Depression and anxiety

Community

- Reduced quality of life
- Disruption to social cohesion
- Disproportionate impact on vulnerable populations





Boats

- F.S. 20.331(7)(e) (Florida Wildlife Commission is empowered to enforce all laws related to boating)
- F.S. 327.60 and 327.65 (limits local governments to regulation of noise from boat engines or exhaust)

■ Food truck events & vehicles

- F.S. 316.3045 (25' plainly audible motor vehicle)
- OCSO monthly detail

Speedways

 F.S. 316.293 (state roadway exemption for motor vehicles in competitive events; County's has a similar exemption)

Fireworks

 Ordinance No. 2025-20 created a Fireworks Ordinance, effective June 20, 2025. (codified in Article VI of Chapter 28 of the Orange County Code)

Section 15-179. Purpose; intent; authority and responsibility of environmental protection officer and investigating officer

(c) Nothing in this article is intended to deter individuals from lawfully exercising the individual right of freedom of speech, or any other rights guaranteed under the Constitution of the United States of America or the Constitution of the State of Florida, or to unreasonably limit or restrain commercial or industrial enterprises.



- Applicable to residential and commercial businesses serving alcohol/suspected illegal activity within I-Drive District and UCF
- Times structured for expected elevated noise levels on weekends
- Distances adjusted for expected mixed use in regional centers

Proposed AmendmentsSection 15-183. Measurement or assessment of noise

(2) Noise disturbances Sounds in violation of subsection 15-494 183(b)(1) shall be confirmed by the investigating officer. The investigating officer who hears a noise disturbance sound that may might be plainly audible shall assess the noise disturbance sound by measuring the distance from the property line or right-of-way line of the source of the noise disturbance sound according to the following standards: sound to a distance that exceeds the distance requirement of the plainly audible standard sound limits in subsection 15-183(b)(1). The investigating officer shall measure such distance, according to the following standards, to determine whether the sound constitutes a noise disturbance:



- b. The investigating officer shall have a direct line of sight and hearing to the real property that is the source of the noise disturbance sound so that the investigating officer can identify the offending source of such noise disturbance sound and the distance involved.
- c. The investigating officer shall use a distance measuring device to measure the distances defined in subsection 15-183(b)(1).

Proposed Amendments Section 15-186. Variances

(c) Any person seeking a variance shall submit an application to the environmental protection officer. At a minimum the applicant shall provide the following information:

•••

(8) Noise compliance and compatibility study.



Section 15-187. Enforcement/penalty.

- Enforcement only initiated ...upon receipt of a noise complaint, and may result in a cease and desist warning, warning letter, notice of violation, civil citation, or criminal citation
- If no valid permit or <u>County approval</u> or variance is in place; shall result in a cease and desist warning ,warning letter, notice of violation, civil citation, or criminal citation
 - Cease and desist warnings issued by OCSO require corrective action within a reasonable time which is defined to be fifteen (15) five minutes

Proposed Amendments

Section 15-189. Reserved. Severability and Conflicts.

The rights and violations provided herein should be interpreted, to the greatest extent possible, in harmony with any superior state or federal law governing the same rights and conduct. To the extent any provision of this article or the application thereof to any person or circumstance impermissibly conflicts with any superior state or federal law governing the same conduct or matter, such provision shall be severable and all other provisions shall remain fully enforceable. Further, if any provision of this article or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this article that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this article are declared severable.





Summary

- Noise Ordinance Study findings indicate that changes are warranted
 - Complaints relating to excessive noise are increasing
 - Current ordinance has standards that may not always allow for adequate resolution of the issues
- Noise complaints are regulated by two agencies with different processes for resolution or enforcement
- Amendments intended to improve ordinance effectiveness and improve public health
- Business impact estimate posted on July 21, 2025; direct economic impact of the proposed amendments to the Noise Control Ordinance are not expected.

Revision to the definition of Regional Center

(32) Regional Center shall mean either the International Drive (I-Drive) District Regional Center or the University of Central Florida (UCF) Regional Center areas, as defined by the Orange County Comprehensive Plan, and any other area defined as a Regional Center by the Orange County Comprehensive Plan, as the Orange County Comprehensive Plan is amended from time to time.







Action Requested

Approval and Adoption of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 15, Article V, of the Orange County Code of Ordinances, known as the "Noise Control Ordinance of Orange County, Florida"; Amending Provisions Pertaining to Definitions, Sound Level Limits, Standards for Measuring Sound, Exemptions, Variances, and Methods of Enforcement; and Providing an Effective Date. All Districts.
