1. Why am I being placed on pretrial release supervision?

You have been placed on this program so that you may be allowed to continue to work and attend school and reside in the community until your case is resolved as an alternative to incarceration.

2. When is my Pretrial Release completed?

You will know that your Pretrial Release supervision is complete when you go to court and a judge tells you it is complete. At that time you may be sentenced to another community based program such as Probation. If the judge refers you to the Pretrial Diversion program, you are <u>still</u> on Pretrial Release until you sign the Pretrial Diversion contract.

3. Why do I have to be drug or alcohol tested?

This may be a condition of your release and/or required by the Community Corrections Division.

4. Who do I have to notify if I move?

If you move you must advise your supervising officer and the Clerk of the Court.
