While we encourage volunteerism, appreciate the extra hands to help provide educational, social and faith based programming, programming space is limited, and needs prioritized. Additionally, not everyone is eligible to access the jail as a volunteer. It is our responsibility to ensure we maintain a safe and secure environment for the inmates in our custody.

Steps to becoming a volunteer:

- 1. Contact Administrator Supervisor Wilbert Danner or Unit Supervisor Isabelle Klier-Graham to schedule an appointment.
- 2. Be prepared to submit your program proposal for review. Please be sure to include the frequency and manpower requirements for the program.
- 3. All proposals will be reviewed and approved by Sr. Corrections Administration.
- 4. If approved, you will be required to submit to a background investigation and provide proof of liability and workers compensation insurance coverage. Individuals with certain past criminal charges may not be allowed to participate as a volunteer.
- 5. Orange County Corrections reserves the right to terminate any volunteer participation.
