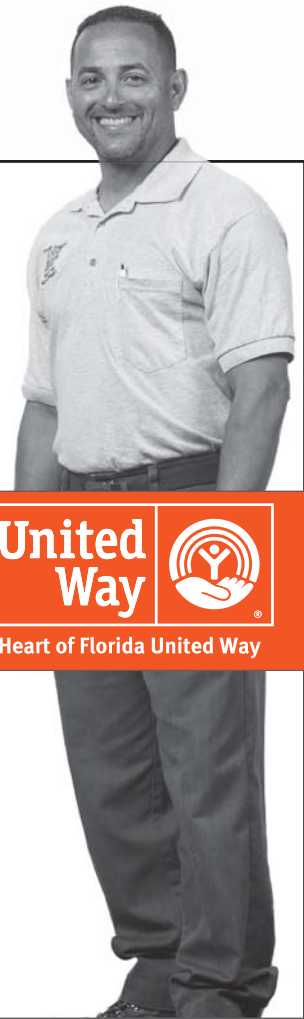




# CARING ABOUT OUR COMMUNITY

Orange County Government employees contributed **\$555,000** to the community through United Way in 2017. Of the 288 companies that run workplace campaigns, we are #1 in the public sector and #4 overall.



More than **2,500** Orange County employees give, advocate and volunteer through United Way to improve community conditions.



Dollar for dollar, Heart of Florida United Way invested \$28 million in programs and services benefitting community members.



Together, we make a difference for **43%** of Orange County residents who are one unexpected bill away from financial emergency.

## Lasting Investments

Since 2010, HFUW has invested almost \$40 million in programs that provide services to over 600,000 Orange County residents.



More than 14,000 students have been served through mentoring, tutoring, and general classroom supports and volunteer projects.



Residents have made 374,923 claims and saved a total of \$8.3 million in prescription drug costs.



33,338 volunteers have contributed 105,538 volunteer hours in community services, which is valued at more than \$2.4 million



More than 782,600 contacts were received via phone, fax, texts and emails. Approximately 1,651,427 Orange County residents (including their families) were assisted.



755,744 tax returns have been filed claiming EITC, resulting in \$1.9 billion in total tax credits.



An additional \$251,325 in cash and in-kind donations have benefited the Orange County school district.
