OAKS SCSP

The Oaks Specialized Community Supervision Program (Oaks SCSP) provides services to Orange County youth between ages 10-18 (youth cannot be 18 YOA at time of admission) that have shown to be at a moderate to high risk of continued involvement with The Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) based on the Positive Achievement Change Tool (PACT) Assessment. The Oaks SCSP provides life skills, impulse control, substance abuse education, individual, anger management and family counseling using Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) to program participants.

The Oaks Program staff is comprised of a Program Manager, a Licensed Mental Health Counseling Services Supervisor, Master's level Senior Children's Services Counselors and Juvenile Probation Officers. Service emphasis is placed on public safety while providing quality and intensive community-based services to families. The Oaks Program seeks to deter the involvement with negative peer groups while promoting and addressing pro-social skills, positive free time activities and educational services support while providing families the skills necessary to develop and sustain supportive family and community-based networks.

Services provided to

- Youth ages 10-18 referred by The Department of Juvenile Justice for intensive counseling and probation services in the community and home.
- Youth residing in Orange County who are currently on probation supervision with the DJJ.

Services include

- Comprehensive family and mental health assessments.
- Specialized Individual Case Planning Services.
- Specialized Probation Supervision Services.
- Promotion of positive community and extra-curricular activities.
