## **SNAP®** stands for STOP NOW AND PLAN.

SNAP® is an award-winning evidence-based program for children ages 6-11 who are experiencing behavior issues. The primary goal of SNAP® is to help children to stop and think before they act, and keep them in school and out of trouble.

### Who should attend SNAP®?

Children ages 6-11 engaging in problematic behavior at home, at school, with persons in authority, and in the community. Behaviors may include lying, stealing, verbal aggression, physical aggression, disruptive behavior, or anger towards siblings/peers.

## **SNAP®** Boys or **SNAP®** Girls Component

- Weekly group sessions for 13 weeks
- Engaging activities include discussion, role plays, and interactive games to learn how to use SNAP® skills
- Topics include self-control, problem-solving, emotional regulation (such as dealing with angry thoughts and feelings), bullying, and relationships

- Parent group meets concurrently with the children's group
