The following resources are currently available to assist smaller businesses and nonprofit organizations:

Florida Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan Program	For profit, privately held employer of 2 - 100 employees; maintaining place of business in FL; previous bridge loans must be paid in full	Up to \$50,000 (special cases up to \$100,000)	Due date: 5/8/20	Interest-free loan up to one year
SBA's Disaster Loan Assistance	Businesses - small businesses, agricultural cooperatives and aquaculture small businesses; must not have credit available from elsewhere; must be physically located in Florida	Up to \$2M; > \$25,000 require collateral	As soon as possible	May be used to pay fixed debts; payroll; accounts payable/other bills; interest rate is 3.75% without credit available elsewhere
SBA's Disaster Loan Assistance	Private nonprofits - cannot be religious or charitable	Up to \$2M; > \$25,000 require collateral	As soon as possible	May be used to pay fixed debts; payroll; accounts payable/other bills; interest rate is 2.75%
